Joint letter from Young Scot, Historic Houses, Historic Environment Scotland and the National Trust for Scotland

We are writing to confirm that, for a second year, Historic Houses, Historic Environment Scotland and the National Trust for Scotland will be offering holders of a Young Scot National Entitlement Card the opportunity to visit many of Scotland's most iconic historic buildings and places for the nominal entry fee of £1.00.

This follows on from the offer made in the Year of Young People 2018 and represents a commitment by our organisations to ensuring there is a legacy from the themed year.

The offer means that anyone aged 11 - 25, with a Young Scot card, will have a choice of 600 properties to visit which exemplify Scotland's built and cultural history, including fabulous and inspirational places like Culloden Battlefield, Stirling Castle and Abbotsford House.

Some conditions will apply, such as under-16s requiring to be accompanied by adults, but the offer will be launched formally from next week and will continue throughout 2019.

We would be most grateful if it would be possible to draw headteachers' attention to the offer so that information can be shared in schools.
